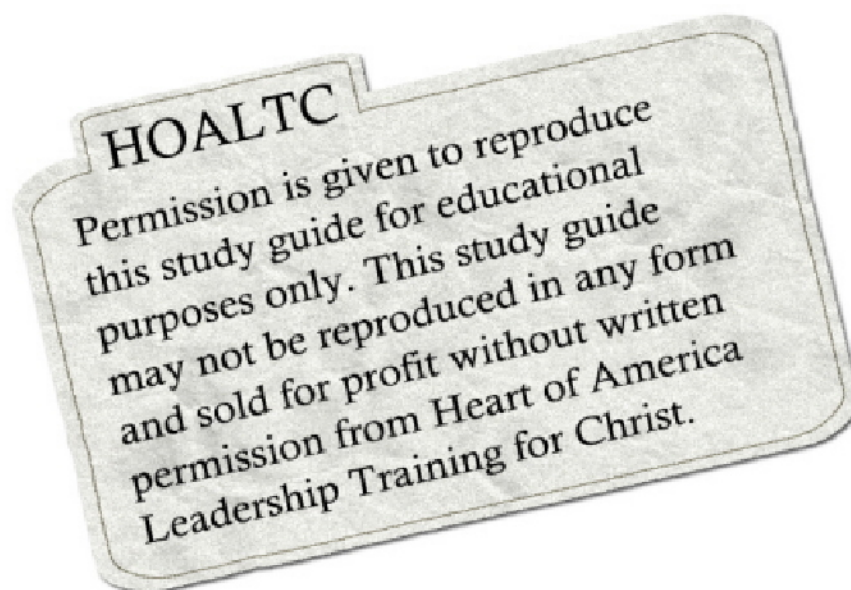

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Introduction

This study guide has been prepared as a study aid for students participating in the Heart of America Leadership Training for Christ (HOALTC) Bible Bowl and Bible Quiz. Questions were derived using the 2011 New International Version of the Holy Bible, and cover the following 34 chapters that address the life of Moses:

Exodus 1 – 20
Numbers 10 – 14
Numbers 20 – 24
Deuteronomy 31 – 34

The HOALTC Bible Bowl is a closed-book, individual event that tests for knowledge of the material. The HOALTC Bible Quiz is an open-book, team event that measures both knowledge and resourcefulness. The rules for each event can be found in the HOALTC Manual, which can be downloaded at www.hoaltc.org. You are encouraged to read the rules thoroughly and identify the event(s) to which your student(s) are best suited.

Because the HOALTC Bible Quiz is comprised of five separate tests, each covering approximately 1/5th of the material, the Study Guide is divided into five sections. They are:

Section One: Exodus 1 - 7

Section Two: Exodus 8 - 13

Section Three: Exodus 14 – 20

Section Four: Numbers 10 – 14, 20 - 21

Section Five: Numbers 22 – 24, Deuteronomy 31 - 34

Multiple choice questions are provided for each chapter, and a one-page “Section Review” is located at the end of each section. The Section Review asks students to identify the chapters in which various section headings are found, information that will be particularly helpful to students participating in Bible Quiz.

Students preparing for the Bible Bowl are encouraged to focus primarily on the multiple choice questions, whereas students preparing for the Bible Quiz are encouraged to focus on both the multiple choice and section review questions.

The Teacher Edition of the Study Guide is identical to the Student Edition in content, but highlights the correct responses and provides reference verses. Additionally, an answer key that displays only the correct answers and reference verses is also available in the Teacher Edition.
